## Phonics Overview

#### Reception

In Reception, children will be taught **Phases 2-4**. Children are introduced to phonemes/sounds and graphemes/letters systematically. They also learn to develop and apply blending and segmenting skills for reading and writing.

#### Year 1

The coherently planned sequence of lessons within **Phase 5** allows opportunities for children to apply their phonics knowledge and skills alongside their reading and writing. It focuses on phonetically decodable two-syllable and three-syllable words and the alternative ways of pronouncing and representing the long vowel phonemes.

### Year 2

By **Phase 6**, children explore spelling patterns and grammar while also developing a breadth of knowledge, skills and understanding in the recognition and spelling of common exception words. This will be taught through **SPaG** lessons.
